## 3. BASCTHOUCHIS

In a natural biddingsystem some bids some bids establishing a gameforce have a very unfrequent occurrence. Some of this bids also have a meaning which could be shown wi th another bid. We want to use this bids in another more frequent way to show special gameforcing hands at a lower level.
One important handtype we want to show with this mechanism is the FG (after pd response) onesuiter to weak to open with FG 2 \&.
If we have now 2 way's to show a FG twosuiter, i.e. via the relay or direct, then the direct way always promises a $5^{+} / 5^{+}$distribution.
After this initial artificial FG bid responder bids a +1 relay and opener shows his hand typ as natural as possible.
If responder does not bid the relay (most unfrequent) he assumes the NAT meaning of the FG bid until told other wise.
Using this method you "win" a lower FG raise of responders suit and a FG bid in openers opened suit. You lose the low bid to show the FG twosu iter in a natural way.

## RULES

- Opener shows his handtyp as natural as possible
- The lowest free bid (a bid with no possible natural meaning) shows the natural meaning of openers initial bid.
- Free bids are : $2 \mathrm{~N} ; 3$ of a higher suit then the opened suit (reverse suit )
- When 3 N is a free bid, it shows a hand with the natural meaning of his initial bid and denies 3 cards in responders suit . He promises a stopper in the $4{ }^{\text {th }}$ suit.
